A - To install

1. Put the CD in the drive. The installation should start automatically.
2. If this does not happen, go to Start > Run and type in D:\Setup.exe and click OK. (If your CD drive letter is not D, please change accordingly, e.g. E:\).
3. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the installation.
4. Click on the desktop icon, or go to Start > All Programs > 2Simple Software > Literacy Collection to launch the program!

B - Getting Started

The resources that are available on the disk can be saved to your computer as separate Word / PDF files or as a zipped collection. If you are using an operating system earlier than XP, you might need to install 3rd party extraction software to open zipped files.

The Literacy Collection texts & resources are available either individually or all in one bundle. If you have a number of separate installations, each will (and should) be installed in its own separate location and have an individual desktop shortcut created for it.

The Literacy Collection: Curriculum Support for KS2

The units of the Literacy Collection are a bank of multi-modal, non-linear, engaging resources that support the five main areas of writing in Key Stage 2: plays, poems, stories, reports and instructions.

What you see on screen is complemented by lesson plans, templates and paper resources which show how each unit can cover 10 hours of Literacy over 2 weeks.

The programs were designed to reflect feedback from schools and research into children's learning.

Features include:

- Accessible and enjoyable classic texts which engage children and help teachers give a confident delivery with high expectations.
- Activities to encourage and develop inference and deduction - something the majority of KS2 schools have identified as a difficult area for children in SATs tests.
- Drama activity videos featuring pupils acting Shakespeare. Young actors make excellent role models for children engaging with the text!
- A delay before children can click to hear the text read back to them, so that they can focus on reading first.
- Time to reflect on images before reading a difficult text, making it easier for children to understand the language and meaning.
- Using video and animation to engage children with narrative and drama, and still images to help concentration when note-taking.
- Summaries of the text translated into the most common community languages: Urdu, Gujarati, Turkish, Bengali and Spanish. These sometimes appear as note/log books - click where you see these icons:
